Stolen Lives

Families with loved ones having a learning disability and/or autism, who are or have been in unsuitable mainstream mental health or specialized learning disability hospital care, are coming together. They are supported by various organizations, including self-advocacy and user-led groups, researchers, and activists.

The group aims to advocate and protest at the Senedd at 1pm on April 17th, with two objectives: to push for improved protection for autistic and learning disabled individuals from crises and detentions, and to release those already detained in improper facilities back to their homes.

Stolen Lives Wales Manifesto for Government Action:

- Determine and inform us about the number of individuals with learning disabilities and/or autism in unsuitable hospitals and assessment units.
- Outline plans to bring children and young people closer to home and relocate them from these facilities.
- Recognize the challenges faced by our families and ensure our voices are heard and respected.
- Reject the notion that sectioning is a resolution or an alternative to addressing individuals' needs.
- Collaborate with organizations representing individuals with learning disabilities and/or autism, along with families, to develop better support systems.

Come and have a cup of tea, have access to fun activities and take a break.



What is the First Aid Awareness training and what is involved?

The First Aid Awareness training is a 4 hour training session run by FAST - First Aid Supplies and Training in partnership with the Vale of Glamorgan Council. This training will give you a basic understanding of what to do in an emergency and how you can help in the situation.

How much does this cost?


