October and November have been really busy and we have offered a wide range of activities and opportunities for carers across the region.

During the past month we have held 20 events or activities and have many more planned over the coming year.

This included holding our *Understanding Disability Award*s 25th Anniversary celebration attended by almost 150 along as many social gatherings and activities variously funded by the *Connected Carers* project and the Vale of Glamorgan council.

We also held training sessions in the use of IT and social media, Carers Rights, and commenced Yoga and more therapy sessions for carers.

Staff and volunteers have contributed to discussions over the forthcoming Learning Disability Strategy, health passports for people using NHS services and the development of better dementia services for people with a learning disability.

Understanding Disability 25th Anniversary Awards





Our popular awards celebrate examples where people have gone the extra distance to involve and include people with a learning disability into everyday life were recently held.





Over 150 people attended the ceremony and enjoyed an emotional and fun day with presentations by our guest speaker, Mike Lewis of the Lloyds Bank Foundation and performances from the Riverbank School Choir, ABC dance group and the Upbeat Performers.





A full report on the day will soon be posted but worthy recipients included a Lifetime Achievement Award for Pauline Young MBE, a 25th Birthday Special Award for Steve Thomas (of <u>ValePlus</u>) and a surprise award to Norbert Flynn the chair of the awards for 25 years in recognition of his outstanding efforts in the 3 decades since he 'retired'.

Partnerships and working together

We work closely with our partners in both Cardiff and the Vale of Glamorgan Councils. We represent the views and concerns of carers and suggest better ways to use scarce resources and press for better services. The local authorities have been working more closely to support people with a learning disability and their carers', sharing roles and overheads and in doing so ensuring better value.

We all appreciate that the current situation can always be better so are constantly seeking parents to let us know what is and is not working well- in this way commissioners will have a better idea of where to focus limited resources.
